Meet Joshua Satin of the Julia Richman Educational Complex

Josh Satin is the Principal of the Ella Baker School, which covers Pre-K to 8th grades, as well as the Building Manager

for the Julia Richman Educational Complex (JREC). JREC is composed of 6 schools: Ella Baker Pre-K to 8th Grade; P226 Middle School for Autistic Children; and four high schools: Manhattan International, Talent Unlimited, Urban Academy, and Vanguard.

Principal Satin has been an educator his whole life. He began at P.S. 38 in East Harlem, then onto a

middle school in Williamsburg and for the last 9 years at JREC, the past 3 as the Ella Baker Principal. The collegial environment at JREC has allowed Principal Satin to build and hone his craft and share his passion with his students. Josh



spoke warmly of the community of JREC. When asked if he ever considers moving on, he said "They couldn't get me out of here. It's too much like home here. My beliefs in progressive education square perfectly with

the philosophy of Ella Baker and her life-long belief in the principles of social justice; equity, access, participation, and rights." He spoke of her influence on the standards for the Ella Baker school. "We strive to provide an education to support both the academic mind of inquiry in math, social studies, science, humanities, and activism and to illustrate our community values of compassion, empathy, and inclusion."

At the end of February, Michael Leocata, GreenbergFarrow, Architect, will be appearing before the NYC Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) to present an application for significant interior and façade renovations at the Bridgemarket Space in the Queensboro Bridge, at First Avenue at E 59th/E. 60th Streets.

If the presentation is approved by LPC, the next step is to sign a lease agreement with Trader Joe's. With a lease in hand, then approval will be sought from the city Department of Buildings. When all the I's are dotted and all the T's are crossed, construction of both the interior and the exterior can begin. Completion date is therefore unknown at this time. 
A Cause to Celebrate – the NYC's Landmarks Law is 55 Years Strong

In April of this year, the Landmarks Preservation Commission will mark the anniversary of its founding in 1965. And it's a special time for ESNA to celebrate the LPC's vital role in protecting New York City's architecturally, historically, and culturally significant buildings and sites. In

October, 2019 the LPC scored a significant legal victory to save from demolition the City and Suburban First Avenue Estate at First Avenue and E. 64th Street. In denying the owner's petition to appeal the



case to the nation's highest court, the Supreme Court ended the years-long legal skirmish to alter this block-square landmark. ESNA salutes the leadership of the Friends of the Upper East Side Historic Districts, our elected officials and concerned citizens with whom we joined to stay the wrecking ball. Bravo!
