Apple Bank for Savings – 1168 First Ave. Has expanded its corner space to the store next door to it, formerly a cleaner.

Bentley Hotel – 500 E. 62 St. The Doe Fund tenants left on July 1. The hotel had an amazing relationship with the Doe Fund residents. The Bentley management considered them a thoroughly professional group. They considered it a pleasure to do business with them. Following their leaving, the hotel was closed for a complete cleaning and renovation. The Bentley is open and ready to welcome the community back to the hotel.

Felice Wine Bar –1166 First Ave. Following a twoweek closing earlier this summer, management renovated the kitchen which included an upgraded air filtration system throughout the restaurant and kitchen.

Goldberger's Pharmacy –1200 First Ave. Has temporarily relocated to **1188 First Ave.** with new window signage. The move was occasioned by the landlord's redoing the existing space to conform with the building's Landmark designation. This relocation will last about a year.

Manhattan Mini Storage -420 E. 62 St. The owners are exploring the possibility of a sale, BUT the intent is to be kept as a storage company.

Mount Vernon Museum & Hotel – 421 East 61 St. The Museum is now doing walking tours and virtual tours, as well as virtual programming and virtual school field trips.

New York School of the Arts -315 E. 62 St. The school is now holding Zoom and in person classes in September and on the weekends in person.

Padoca Bakery – 210 E. 67 St. Newly relocated after a brief absence from the ESNA community. Welcome back!

Serendipity 3 - 225 East 60 St. Has reopened. It has a new kitchen, a revamped restaurant and has refreshed the iconic décor - and some new menu items.

TD Bank –1110 Third Ave. Has relocated to this location from its former address at 1091 Third Ave.



Changes in the Neighborhood

24 Sycamores Park – York Avenue at East 61 St.

The upper level of the park has reopened. It has

been resurfaced, new safety surface; Park House has been restored to the original brick and the Bathroom interiors completely redone and are ADA accessible; Flagpole



repainted. Pruning and repainting of park benches remain to be completed.

Ed Koch Queensboro Bridge – (You all know where it's located!!!)

By the end of 2022, the South Outer Roadway to be converted to two lanes for

pedestrians with Fencing added. At the top of the 59th Street ramp, would be fenced in and be like a small plaza after the Jersey barriers are removed. The



North Outer Roadway would then be for bicycles only.

249 East 62 St.

This vacant lot will soon be the site of 25-story

apartment building consisting of 66 for-sale residential condominium units with retail space on the ground floor. The building's design reflects the rich heritage of the Treadwell Historic District, as well as the Upper East Side, by incorporating



the rustication and hues found in the façades of its neighbors. Additionally, the building is designed to be respectful of its context; the bulk of the massing is

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located on Second Ave and the frontage on 62 St., where the residential entry will be, is limited to five stories. Construction started in July and completion is anticipated for 2023.
