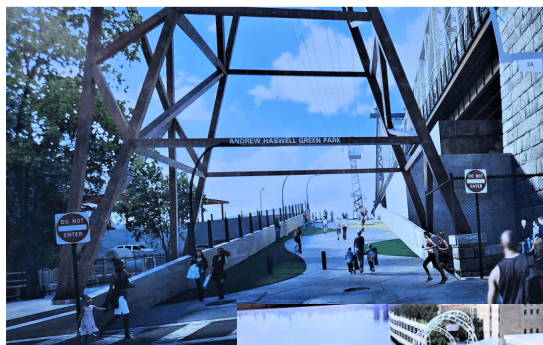

Eighteen years ago, it was nothing more than the glimmer of a dream. That's when two members of Manhattan Community Board 8 helped establish the 197-A Plan Committee. That's the section of the City Charter that allowed the Board to tell the city how it wants unused or underused city owned property to be developed. In this case, the site was the abandoned former heliport on the East River at E. 60th Street. Today that site is the home to the Andrew Haswell Green Pavilion, the dog run and garden on the East River Esplanade. And by the end of next year, the Andrew Haswell Green Phase 2B will be a large, luxurious lawn welcoming park goers.

To mark the transition from dream to reality, on October 7, 2022 the formal sign, making the area as the ANDREW HASWELL GREEN PARK was unveiled! Congratulations to CB 8M, the NYC Department of Parks and the Economic Development Corporation.

Upper East Side Private School Plans Major Expansion After a Century



After operating for more than 100 years out of a handful of small buildings on East 62nd Street, the Browning School is planning a major expansion to its Lenox Hill campus.

The private K-12 school for boys has far outgrown its longtime home between Park and Madison avenues. Now, Browning plans to move its entire high school a few blocks to the northeast, taking over a 105-year-old parking garage building at 337 East 64th St.

Browning plans to renovate the ornate facility in time for the 2024-2025 school year.

Once renovated, the garage building will become home to 13 classrooms and offices across four floors, plus a library and cafeteria in the cellar, a regulation-sized gym on the upper floors, and a green roof.

Changes coming to the 1st Avenue Buses

First Avenue will have a new “off-set” bus lane next to the curb lane, from E. 61 to E. 79 Streets. The buses will continue to pull over to the curb for bus stops. This is the busiest bus lane in NYC with 48,000 daily riders. The meter parking along that stretch will also change to 2 hour meter parking for blocks with small stores and 3 hour parking for blocks with retail chains.
